	• KCC has increased council tax by 4.99% for 2019/20. 2% of which is set aside for social care.			
	• A government injection of funding has ensured no cuts to discretionary services.			
	• £29million has been made available to ensure road networks remain open during Brexit. Lorries will be rigorously routed. Hopefully any infrastructure put in place will assist the campaign to keep HGVs out of rural areas and towns. A trial area has been identified south of Maidstone.

9. PLANNING APPLICATIONS	18 03264 FULL Tumbledown Cottage Chapel Lane. Two storey/roof extension to rear east elevation including two dormer windows and dormer window to side south elevation. The Parish Council unanimously agreed to support this application.	
	18 03810 FULL Redhouse Barn Goddards Green Road. Conversion and extension of rural building and its curtilage to residential use, plus demolition of existing outbuildings and erection of new garage/stable building. Cllr Beveridge declared an interest in this application and left the meeting during discussions. Cllrs Thomas and Driver had visited the site. The Parish Council felt this is a rebuild rather than a conversion and whilst the proposed appearance may be better, both buildings height will increase and the application does not meet TWBC H13 policy criteria that (1) – The building would be capable of conversion without extensive alteration or rebuilding and/or extension. Or (2) The conversion can be achieved without detrimental effect on the buildings fabric or character. The proposed erection of new garage/stable building are a substantial increase in built form on the site, and could be capable of being converted to another separate dwelling in the future. The Parish Council supports the Landscape and Biodiversity Officer's opinion that in AONB terms the application cannot meet the requirement to conserve and enhance. For these reasons the Parish Council by majority agreed to object to the application.	
	18 03864 FULL Ryecroft Chapel Lane. Erection of new entrance gate. The Parish Council unanimously agreed to support the application.  19 00011 FULL Cotts Farm. Stationing of a mobile home in connection with land and buildings at Cott Farm. Cllr Thomas declared an interest in this application and left the mosting during discussions. The Parish Council
