1. APOLOGIES	Apologies were received from Cllr Dawlings.	
2. DECLARATION OF INTERESTS	Cllr Beveridge declared an interest in planning application 22/00021/FULL Redhouse Barn - neighbour; Cllr Cochrane declared an interest in planning application 22/00866/FULL The Copper House – applicant; Cllr Thomas declared an interest in planning application 22/00866/FULL The Copper House – agent employee. No part was taken in discussions or decisions of the applications.	
3. MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING	The Parish Council minutes from the meeting held on 21st March 2022 were unanimously approved as a correct record of the meeting.	
4. REPORTS BY COUNTY/ BOROUGH COUNCILLORS	Ukrainian support: There is a huge amount of co-ordination work taking place between TWBC and KCC. A dedicated website has been set up https://twhelpsukraine.info/	
	Cllr Warne reported: Brick Kiln Farm – permission was originally granted in 2021 but the applicant withdrew, and the land sold to Hill Residential, who have been much more engaging with the community and provided a detailed application which was passed by Committee. Cllr Warne had declared an interest in the application as she is now employed by Natural England and will declare an interest on applications not supported by Natural England. Climate Emergency Advisory Panel - TWBC set a commitment for the council's operations and services to be carbon neutral by 2030. The Panel has no decision-making powers but works with officers addressing the climate emergency. Climate action is the responsibility of everyone and a new climate action website has been launched https://twbcclimateaction.co.uk/ Cllr Holden reported: Operation Brock - has been in place and the M20 closed, but traffic has been kept moving away from	
	the motorway. Kent Plan Bee – along a bus route from Dartford to Gravesham bus shelters with sedum and wildflower on the roofs have been installed to attract bees and pollinators.	
	Cllr Dawlings reported: Town & Country Housing - manages most of the social housing in the Borough. Part of Peabody group building about 200 new social housing properties a year. TCH has a programme to replace/sell old environmentally inefficient properties and invest in new properties for social housing.	
5. REPORTS BY CHAIR AND PARISH COUNCILLORS	Nothing to report.	
6. PARISH COUNCIL ELECTIONS	The election is uncontested. The new term for Parish Councillors commences 10 th May 2022. One vacancy remains and the co-option process will run from 6 th May to 27 th June.	
7. PLANNING	Cllr Holden thanked Parish Councillors for their hard work and commitment and congratulated them on an uncontested election as an indication that parishioners are happy with their council's work.	
	 Planning applications 22/00021/FULL Redhouse Barn, Goddards Green Road. Conversion and extension of rural barn and its curtilage to residential use; demolition of three existing outbuildings and erection of new garage/stable building 	
	Recent Site History: 18/03810/FULL Conversion of building to form a 2-bed single storey dwelling, small extension on west side of the building to accommodate 2nd bedroom. BPC objected on grounds	

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of not being a straight-forward conversion; amounted to a rebuild. TWBC APPROVED.

19/03627/FULL Conversion of building to form a 3-bed 2-storey/level dwelling with larger extension to west side of building. Involving digging out to achieve the 2-storey/level. BPC objected on grounds of total rebuild and not a conversion. TWBC REFUSED. Applicant appealed — APPEAL DISMISSED 21/3/2021. 22/00021/FULL (Current application) Conversion of building to form a 3-bed 2-storey/level dwelling. This is a revised scheme following the refusal and dismissed appeal for the previous scheme under 19/03627/FULL. There is an extant permission under 18/03810/FULL.

D&A Statement: Ground levels within half of the floor space will be lowered to accommodate open plan kitchen, dining and living space. Scale and mass of the building will not change significantly; ridge line and roof form is same as approved scheme. The building will have a single storey appearance.

The Parish Council unanimously agreed to object to this application for the following reasons:

- Overall size of proposal extending the footprint of both barn and stable/garage block is excessive.
- Excessive fenestration to gable ends and addition of windows on south and north elevations.
- No detail included in the application about solar panels on roof of garage/stable block. Whilst the Parish Council encourages the use of renewable energy, this proposal may be detrimental to the fabric and character of a rural equestrian building.
- Scale and extent of works requires extensive alteration to the structure including an extension. The scheme does not satisfy criterion 1 TWBC LP 2006 Policy H13 which states that a building must be capable of conversion without extensive alteration or rebuilding and/or extension.
- Para 12 of the Appeal Inspector's decision 15 March 2021 states in reference to criterion 2 of Policy H13: 'Indeed, the stable/garage in combination with the extensive alterations to the principal building set out above, that include steps to the front and rear elevations and urban style double height fenestration to a gable end, would be in stark contrast and disproportionate in comparison to the existing low-key structures or the modest conversion that the Council found acceptable. As such, I conclude that the bulk and extent of the proposal would erode and diminish the unassuming rural character and fabric of the host building. Therefore, the proposal does not accord with criterion 2 of Policy H13 which requires that a conversion can be achieved without detrimental effect on the building's fabric or character.' The current proposal eliminates the steps to the front and rear elevations in the design but does not address the gable end fenestration and the concerns expressed by the inspector about the erosion of the unassuming rural character and fabric of the host building. This suggests that compliance with criterion 2 is not satisfied under this scheme.
- **22/00856/TPO T1** Large Oak Tree Benenden Recreation Ground Tree to be removed to ground level with the potential to be replanted.
- Applicant is the tree surgeon on behalf of BVT.
- Sited in the CA and protected by a TPO (ref: 019/2006).
- The tree is diseased throughout and in major decline with increasing amounts of large dead wood, decay at the base and movement across the whole tree.
- Tree condition is a risk to the public and the roadside.

The Parish Council unanimously agreed to support this application.

- 22/00866/FULL The Copper House, Hinksden Road. Install solar panels on a flat garage roof.
- Number of site constraints: AONB, Outside LBD1, etc.
- Listed Buildings in proximity: Diprose House to the north Grade II listed unaffected. Info:
- The site originally contained an agricultural worker's bungalow built in 1960s. Replaced in 2013 (under app: 13/01763/FULL) by current owner and applicant with a single-storey 3-bed dwelling, basement and detached garage and store with various eco-friendly elements.

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	Materials: Currently flat roof covered in membrane on a single storey garage clad in cedar strips. Proposed: black plastic and glass solar PV panels. Trees unaffected.
